JULY 10, 2025 OZARK FOOTHILLS REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION

OZARK FOOTHILLS RPC, POPLAR BLUFF, MISSOURI

I. Call to Order

Chairman Brian Polk called the meeting to order at 6:14 p.m.

II. Open for Public Discussion

No public discussion ensued.

III. Adoption of April 10, 2025 Minutes

The minutes of the April 10, 2025 TAC meeting were reviewed. The minutes were adopted on a motion by Vince Lampe, Butler County, and second by Michael Williams, Ripley County.

IV. Missouri Department of Transportation Reports

Mike Brandon, MoDOT Southeast District, stated the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission approved the 2026-2030 Statewide Transportation Improvement Plan (STIP) program on July 9, 2025. There are over 1,200 projects worth more than \$13.3 billion using both state and federal funds.

Katy Bower, MoDOT Southeast District, stated they are hoping to get Route KK in Wayne County out to bid next week. This will be a temporary low water crossing to get the road open and to try and get the project into a future STIP to put in a bridge and widen to 2 lanes.

Brain Polk asked if that project should be prioritized by the TAC at a future meeting. Mike Brandon said they are looking into getting funding to make the improvements, but the TAC could prioritize the project.

Melissa Rose, MoDOT Southeast District, announced the Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) call for projects ends July 11, 2025. There are no projects submitted at this time from the OFRPC region.

V. Transportation Planning Coordinator Report

Ozark Foothills Transportation Planning Coordinator Andrew Murphy stated the RPC is still waiting on award notifications regarding the 42 CDBG MIT/MID applications that were submitted in January 2025. The CDBG MIT/MID funding is tied to the 2017 flood event.

For the regular FY25 CDBG grant application cycle, the RPC is working on 10 applications including paving projects for the Cities of Neelyville, Qulin, Ellington, Williamsville, and Wayne County. Applications are due July 28, 2025.

There have been no updates on the Delta Regional Authority's (DRA) funding. DRA's Critical Infrastructure Fund (CIF) applications are open. The CIF looks to make investments that support projects that address flood control, basic public infrastructure, and transportation infrastructure improvements. The applications are accepted on a rolling basis and projects are competitive in the entire DRA region. Projects can request up to \$2 million.

The Delta Regional Authority SEDAP Application Cycle usually opens in March with a late June due date, but has yet to open. DRA's focus is on Transportation Infrastructure, Basic Public Infrastructure, Healthcare, Workforce Development, and Small Business and Entrepreneurship.

TAP applications are due July 11, 2025. As Ms. Rose stated earlier, no projects were submitted from the OFRPC region.

The Federal Lands Access Program (FLAP) applications are open. The program goal is to "Improve transportation facilities that provide access to, are adjacent to, or are located within federal lands." This is the first Call for Projects since September 2021. We've written several for Carter County over the years that have been awarded, and submitted one for Carter and one for Butler County in January 2022. The Carter County project was County Road 201 and for Butler County it was County Roads 434 and 436 leading to Beaver Lake Recreation Area.

The round opened July 1st and due dates are October 1, 2025. The State of Missouri has a total of \$4.4 million available. Projects once again can be 100% funded and require no match. This call for projects is programming funding for FY27-FY29.

Proposed projects or studies must be associated with a public highway, road, bridge, trail or transit system that is located on, is adjacent to, or provides access to Federal lands for which the transportation facility's title or maintenance responsibility is vested with a State, county, city, township, tribal, municipal, or other local government entity.

Robert Augsdorfer, OFRPC Community Planning Specialist, stated he is working with each of the five counties to put together a county-wide task force to provide feedback and help in development of the Ozark Foothills Region Comprehensive Safety Action Plan. He has met with all five counties and 16 cities in the region to explain the development of the plan. A couple of the counties are close in having their Task Force complete. The OFRPC is looking for about 10 members to serve for each county. Each group will meet 4 times over the next year and half and all meetings will be open to the public and held in locations in their county.

Mr. Augsdorfer provided a Safe Streets for All transportation survey to the TAC for them to complete at the meeting. Questions include forms of transportation an individual most frequently uses, average commute times, locations of concerns, etc. He also asked if any additional questions come to mind, to please let him know as a general public survey for each county is forthcoming.

VI. Old Business

Mr. Murphy reported the updated Ozark Foothills Regional Transportation Plan was approved by the OFRPC Board of Directors at the June Board meeting and has been submitted to MoDOT.

Amber Hornbeck, OFRPC Project Officer, has made great progress on Qulin's Active Transportation Plan. She received 32 surveys from the community, about 7% of Qulin's population, and conducted a Walk Audit for the community in late May that saw Mr. Murphy and Mr. Augsdorfer also attend. Joining them were Qulin City Officials, Qulin PD, Butler County Health Department, Gary Pride from our TAC and the Poplar Bluff Airport, The Bootheel Regional Planning Commission, local citizens and representatives from Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services and Missourians for Responsible Transportation. She held a final public meeting on July 9th, and the plan will be wrapped up in September.

VII. New Business

MoDOT will be hosting a public meeting to give the public the opportunity to comment on the High Priority Unfunded Needs List on August 28th from 4-6 p.m. at the OFRPC office.

Our next regularly schedule TAC meeting is October 9, 2025. Mr. Murphy announced he is having a child due October 15, 2025 she's running big and suspects she'll arrive earlier than the due date. There are quite a few conferences and meetings occurring in September, so there wasn't a lot of options to move the meeting to, so after consultation with TAC Chairman Brian Polk and OFRPC Executive Director Alan Lutes, the next TAC meeting is being scheduled for Thursday September 25, 2025.

Finally, the committee divided into five groupings separated by county. Ballots for projects, maintenance, and multi-modal needs were presented for use in the prioritization process and the voting procedure was explained. Each individual could cast five votes; a minimum of one had to be used for a project in a county outside of the voter's county of representation. Each TAC member could then cast the remaining four votes to any project or projects he or she desired. The ballot sheets with the total number of votes for each project are attached.

VIII. General Discussion

No general discussion ensued.

IX. Adjournment

Steve Chitwood, Reynolds County, moved to adjourn. Chairman Polk adjourned the meeting at 7:12 p.m.
